#### ALIGNMENT OF LOCAL GOVERNMENT DEVELOPMENT PLANS WITH NDP IV

The objectives of NDP IV include consolidating, increasing stock, and enhancing the quality of productive infrastructure. Key areas of focus include transport interconnectivity, sustainable energy development, and sustainable urban development.

# 1. Program: Transport Infrastructure Development and Services

Local governments aim to increase the stock of productive and quality road networks. Efforts are underway to collaborate with the Ministry of Works and Transport (MoWT) and the Uganda Road Fund (URF) to improve maintenance and ensure road units are available at both district and regional levels. Additionally, there is lobbying

budget allocations from URF to cover a broader road network.

#### 2. Sustainable Energy Development

The objective is to extend power to rural areas, ensuring all households have access to electricity. Urban councils aim to have power available for agricultural processing. Efforts are also focused on encouraging the production of solar power and connecting it to the national grid to ensure a stable supply.

# 3. Sustainable Urban Development

Initiatives include promoting green belts, installing lighting around district headquarters, constructing quality markets, opening streets to expand towns, and providing safe water to communities. Urbanization efforts are

supported by upgrading town boards, town councils, municipalities, and cities.

#### **Existing Programs and Policies**

The Uganda Road Fund (URF) supports road maintenance through funding annual programs and the Road Maintenance Grant (RMG). Additional funding sources for rural road maintenance, such as the Rural Transport Infrastructure (RTI) project under MoWT, are also being explored.

#### **Maintenance Policy for FY 2024/2025**

Maintenance plans for the year will follow specific policy guidelines:

1. Performance Agreements will serve as key contracts between URF and designated agencies, as well as

- between districts and their sub-counties and town councils, to ensure delivery of agreed annual work programs.
- 2. District, Urban, and Community Access Road (DUCAR) network works will use the Force Account (FA) method, with a mix of FA and contracting allowed on national and city roads.
- 3. Routine maintenance will apply to road sections not undergoing other interventions.
- 4. For district roads, priority is maintenance of connections to UNRA roads.
- 5. For urban roads, priority is given to roads connecting to district roads.
- 6. Community access roads will prioritize removing bottlenecks, with community-driven work through the Burungi Bwansi approach.

# **Staffing Levels**

Staffing is generally sufficient, with a few adjustments planned.

- 3. Health structures i.e. staff quarters and hospitals.

#### CHALLENGES FACED AND POSSIBLE RELEVANT INTERVENTION.

#### **Budgetary Constraints**

- 1. **Insufficient Budget Allocation**: Current funding is inadequate for the entire 2150.7 KM network, with partial fund releases.
  - Intervention: Intensify lobbying to secure additional funds.
- Limited Funding Sources: Only URF and RMG fund road maintenance.
  - Intervention: Seek additional grants like the RTI project and DRDIP for road projects.
- 3. **High Cost of Swamp Crossings**: Limited budget prevents constructing essential swamp crossings.
  - Intervention: Lobby the Ministry of Works for culverts and special funding.
- 4. **Unfunded New Local Governments**: New town councils and sub-counties lack funding.
- 5. **Rising Fuel Prices**: Budgeting challenges due to fluctuating fuel costs.

#### **General Recommendations**

- 1. Encourage Public-Private Partnerships (PPP) for community road maintenance.
- 2. Use 15% mechanical imprest in Q1 to buy truck tyres.
- 3. Adjust work plans to accommodate emergencies.
- 4. Deduct and budget for NSSF contributions, including previous arrears.

#### **Technical Issues**

- 1. **Outdated District Vehicles**: Current vehicles are unreliable and costly to maintain.
  - Intervention: Procure a robust field pickup for transporting essential items.
- 2. **Blocked Drains by Residents**: Some residents obstruct drainage, damaging road surfaces.
  - Intervention: Enhance community sensitization during construction works.
- 3. **Centralized Road Equipment Servicing**: Delays and inefficiencies in servicing equipment.

- 4. Lack of Second Road Unit: Limits coverage of the road network.
- 5. **No Low-Bed Trailer**: Inability to transport heavy equipment to distant areas.

#### **Environmental/Weather Challenges**

- Impact of Rain on Earth Roads: Roads deteriorate quickly in rainy seasons.
  - Intervention: Upgrade roads to first-class gravel for durability (2-4 years).
